


		<b>City</b>	A place where many people live together. A city has many buildings and streets. It is bigger than a town.	
		<b>Compass</b>	A tool for finding direction	
		<b>Direction</b>	The path that something takes, the path that must be taken to reach a specific place or the way you are facing.	
		<b>Far</b>	Distant	
		<b>Hill</b>	A landform that is higher than the surrounding area	
		<b>Home</b>	The place where a person lives	
		<b>House</b>	A building where someone lives	
		<b>Key/legend</b>	Gives you the information needed for the map to make sense	
		<b>Locate</b>	Find	
		<b>Map</b>	A picture someone has made of an area	
		<b>Near</b>	Close	
		<b>North, South, East, West</b>	Compass points	
		<b>Observe</b>	Carefully watching someone or something	
		<b>Office</b>	An office is a room or a part of a building where people work sitting at desks	
		<b>Position</b>	A position is the point where something is located/found	
		<b>Route</b>	A way from one place to another	
		<b>School</b>	A place where people go to learn	
		<b>Shop</b>	A place where things are sold	
<b>Street</b>	A road, typically with houses and buildings on one or both sides			
<b>Diagrams</b>		<b>Symbol</b>	Picture on a map to show a feature on a map	
		<b>Town</b>	A place with many streets and buildings, where people live and work. Towns are larger than villages and smaller than cities	
<b>Geographical Skills and Enquiries</b>		<b>Train Station</b>	A place on a railway line where trains stop for people to get on and off trains.
