


<p>Black Tudors</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">John Blanke 1507- <p>A famous black trumpeter who's image is shown twice on the Westminster Roll in 1511 when Catherine of Aragon and Henry VIII celebrated the birth of their first son.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Cattelena of Almondsbury <p>Cattelena lived in the village of Almondsbury, seven miles north of Bristol, in the west of England. Her Hispanic-sounding name suggests that she may have arrived in England via Spain, Portugal or their colonies. What is known about Cattelena comes from a list of the goods that she owned, which was created after her death.</p>		<p>Barbados Slave Code</p> <p>Colonisation</p> <p>Colony</p> <p>Cotton</p> <p>Indentured slaves</p> <p>Royal African Company</p> <p>Plantation</p> <p>Slave</p> <p>Sugar Cane</p> <p>Tobacco</p> <p>Slave Trade</p>	<p>The Barbados slave code established that enslaved Africans be treated as chattel.</p> <p>the action or process of settling among and establishing control over the indigenous people of an area.</p> <p>a country or area controlled politically by a more powerful country</p> <p>Cotton is a soft, fluffy staple fiber that grows in a boll, or protective case, around the seeds of the cotton plants</p> <p>Indentured servitude is a form of labour where an individual is under contract to work without a salary to repay an indenture or loan within a certain timeframe.</p> <p>The Royal African Company (RAC) was an English trading company established in 1660 by the House of Stuart and City of London merchants to trade along the West African coast.</p> <p>Plantations are farms specializing in cash crops, usually mainly planting a single crop, with perhaps ancillary areas for vegetables for eating</p> <p>Slavery is the ownership of a person as property, especially in regards to their labour.</p> <p>Sugarcane or sugar cane is a species of (often hybrid) tall, perennial grass (in the genus <i>Saccharum</i>, tribe Andropogoneae) that is used for sugar production</p> <p>Tobacco is the common name of several plants in the genus <i>Nicotiana</i> of the family Solanaceae, and the general term for any product prepared from the cured leaves of these plants</p> <p>1. the procuring, transporting, and selling of human beings as slaves, in particular the former trade in black Africans as slaves by European countries and North America.</p>	<p>The first British colony was in North America was in Jamestown, Virginia in 1607.</p> <p>The second British colony settlement was in Barbados also called Jamestown in 1625.</p> <p>British involvement in the transatlantic slave trade began in 1562, and by the 1730s Britain was the world's biggest slave-trading nation.</p> <p>The triangular route from Europe to Africa, to the Americas and back to Europe was highly lucrative. London was the financial heart of the system, and ships from Liverpool, London and Bristol dominated the slave routes, supported by Glasgow and Lancaster.</p> <p>The Royal African Company traded in slaves. The company was set up in 1672 by James, Duke of York, Charles II's brother. It was the largest slave trade company in Europe. Slaves were branded on their chests with the letters RAC.</p>
