Plagiarism can happen anywhere, but online it is much easier to do. Sometimes we don't even realise we are doing it but whenever you copy something off the internet - be it a picture, some information or a video - if you do not have permission from the owner of that digital information it can be plagiarism.</p> <p>Why is plagiarism bad?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">The creator doesn't get recognition.The plagiariser might earn recognition or even money from someone else's work.It is the same thing as cheating or lying.It is stealing; especially if you make money from it. <p>If you find information that you think is useful for your project write it in your own words. This will help you to learn the information and also means you won't hand in something that you clearly haven't written! Make a note of the exact website address that you got it from and mention this in your work - this is called citation.</p> <p>Gaming addiction:</p> <p>Gaming addiction is the uncontrolled playing of video games, causing problems in your life. Gaming addiction is a serious problem. It can affect your sleep, eating and time spent with friends. Spending too much time gaming can also damage your friendships, schoolwork, physical health and mental health.</p> <p>If you are worried that you or someone you know is developing an addiction to gaming, it's important to talk to a trusted adult about the problem.</p> <p>Remember:</p> <p>If in doubt, click out!</p>
