God wants us to talk to Him and treat Him as our best friend; God has created us, his children, to know, love and serve Him in this life and forever - this is our purpose and goal and will bring us true happiness; We are created as a unity of body, mind and spirit; We are part of God's family; Saying sorry is important and can mend friendships; Jesus cared for others and has expectations of them and how they should act; We should love other people in the same way God loves us.</p> <p>To identify 'special people' (their parents, carers, friends, parish priest) and what makes them special; How their behaviour affects other people, and that there is appropriate and inappropriate behaviour; Different types of teasing and that all bullying is wrong and unacceptable.</p> <p>To recognise when they have been unkind and say sorry; To recognise when people are being unkind to them and others and how to respond; To understand safe and unsafe situations, including online</p> <p>The difference between 'good' and 'bad' secrets and that they can and should be open with 'special people' they trust if anything troubles them; To know that they are entitled to bodily privacy; That God is love: Father, Son and Holy Spirit; That being made in his image means being called to be loved and to love others.</p> <p>To know what a community is, and that God calls us to live in community with one another; Jesus' teaching on who is my neighbour.</p>
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Personal Relationships	<p><b>Pupils should be taught:</b></p> <p>The characteristics of positive and negative relationships</p> <p>To identify special people (e.g. family, carers, friends) and what makes them special</p> <p>There are different family structures and these should be respected</p> <p>Families should be a place of love, security and stability.</p> <p>The importance of spending time with your family</p> <p>How their behaviour affects other people and that there are appropriate and inappropriate behaviours</p> <p>To recognise when people are being unkind to them and others and how to respond</p> <p>Different types of teasing and bullying which are wrong and unacceptable</p>   																																																															
	<p><b>Keeping Safe</b></p> <p><b>Pupils should be taught:</b></p> <p><b>Keeping safe</b></p> <p>To recognise safe and unsafe situations and ways of keeping safe, including simple rules for keeping safe online</p> <p>To use simple rules for resisting pressure when they feel unsafe or uncomfortable</p> <p>The difference between good and bad secrets</p> <p>Identifying and correctly name their "private parts" (see NSPCC resource PANTS) for the purposes of safeguarding them from sexual exploitation</p> <p>Importance of seeking and giving permission in relationships.</p> <p><b>People who can help me</b></p> <p>Who to go to if they are worried or need help</p> <p>That there are a number of different people and organisations they can go to for help in different situations</p>
