<p><u>Number</u> Children will focus on Place Value within 50. They will be counting to and from 100 and writing numbers to 100. They will be studying ordinal numbers and look at addition and subtraction to 20. We will begin learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s.</p> <p><u>Measurement</u> We will look at length, height, mass and volume.</p>	<p>RE</p> <p><u>Galilee to Jerusalem</u> Year 1 will share the following key texts: The Presentation (Lk 2:22-38); Finding in the temple and the hidden life (Lk 2:41-52); Jesus announces his mission (Lk 4:16-22); The call of the disciples (Lk 5:1-11); Little children (Lk 18:15-17) and Zacchaeus (Lk 19:1-9). They will know that the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus is celebrated by Christians around the world and is known as Candlemas in Britain. They will learn that all Christians are called to follow Jesus and share the Good News with others and are called to take care of each other, especially those most in need, such as the poor. We will share the teaching that Jesus is the light to all nations and that He is the Son of God.</p> <p><u>Desert to Garden</u> In this unit, children will share the following stories: Jesus enters Jerusalem (Lk 19:28-38); Jesus teaches in the temple (Lk 19:47-48); The widow's mite (Lk 21:1-6); The Last Supper (Lk 22:7-23); The Crucifixion and death of Jesus (Lk 23:33-46) and the angel's message (Lk 24:1-8).</p> <p><u>Catholic Social Teaching Focus - Solidarity and Peace</u></p>	<p>This term, the children will read a range of traditional stories and variations of these. They will also enjoy stories such as The Jolly Postman, Funnybones and other stories by Janet and Allan Ahlberg. Children will write their own acrostic and image poems as well as a traditional tale, a journey story, a setting description and a recount. They will focus on writing sentences using capital letters, full stops and adjectives. Spelling rules will be taught/revised weekly. Phonics will be taught daily.</p>
<p><u>Spring</u> Children learn about the changing seasons, focusing on how winter turns into spring and the signs this brings, such as warmer weather and new growth.</p> <p><u>Plants</u> Later they will study plants, learning to name common plants, identify their basic parts, and understand what plants need to grow and stay healthy, including water, light, air, nutrients from soil, and the right temperature.</p>	<p><u>Year 1 Spring Term</u></p> <p><u>Looking Back in Time...</u></p>  <p>Zacchaeus</p>  <p>Crucifixion</p>	<p>History</p> <p><u>Local Heroes</u> In History we will learn about the lives of local area heroes including Oliver Goldsmith, John Logie Baird, Amy Johnson and Ernest Trobridge and consider the impact they made. <p><u>Feet 1 and Hands 2</u> Children will participate in ball skills activities, developing simple tactics for attacking and defending along with learning rules, working together and helping others.</p> <p><u>Playing Games</u> Children will learning important sports skills when playing games.</p> <p><u>The Zoo</u> Children will be move and dance to different animal movements.</p>	<p><u>Printing and Weaving</u> In Art we explore a range of different objects and materials that can be used for printing, create simple patterns, look at natural materials and the textures they can create, experiment with man-made tools and the textures they create before creating a final printing piece. We will go on to explore Michael Brennard-Wood's weaving, experimenting with some paper weaving as an introduction to this textiles module and then designing and creating their own super woven Easter basket ready to fill!</p>	<p>In Computing, children will learn about moving a robot (Beebot) and how we can group data. E-safety will be an ongoing theme in Computing lessons but children will also learn about the importance of keeping personal information safe and be introduced to the message of 'if in doubt, click out'.</p>
Music	Italian	PSHE
Children will explore pitch (high and low) and create music linked to sound effects and storytelling.	Year 1 will be discussing animals and colours in Italian lessons and will consolidate their learning with singing related songs.	PSHE this term will cover a range of themes including, 'special people', 'treat others well...', 'and say sorry', 'good and bad secrets', 'physical contact', 'harmful substances' and 'can you help me?'
