Maths	Religious Education	English
<p>Multiplication & Division: Children will multiply 2- and 3-digit numbers, recall multiplication facts, and divide 2- and 3-digit numbers by a 1-digit number, learning relevant division facts.</p> <p>Measurement: Length and Perimeter: Children will calculate lengths in metres and kilometres, find equivalents, and determine the perimeter of regular and irregular polygons. They will solve for missing lengths in compound shapes.</p> <p>Number: Fractions: Children will understand fractions, find tenths, identify equivalent fractions, work with fractions greater than 1 and calculate fractions of an amount. They will also add and subtract fractions.</p> <p>Number: Decimals: Children will learn about decimal place value, find tenths and hundredths and divide 1- and 2-digit numbers by 100.</p>	<p>Galilee to Jerusalem</p> <p>Year 4 Pupils will listen to stories from the Gospel of Matthew, including Jesus healing the sick, Jesus walking on Water, and helping people in need. Children will learn that Jesus is both God and human, the Messiah, who came to serve, not to rule. They'll see how Jesus welcomed everyone and how his healing work continues today. Pupils will understand why Catholics say the Creed at Mass, and how God offers forgiveness and healing through the sacraments. Year 4 will learn about people and organisations inspired by Jesus who care for those who are sick or excluded.</p> <p>Desert to Garden</p> <p>In this unit, children will learn about forgiveness and mercy especially during the season of Lent and Holy Week. Pupils will listen to Bible stories such as <i>The Prodigal Son</i> and <i>The Sheep and the Goats</i>. Children will learn that God always loves and forgives us. They'll also understand that Lent is a special time to make a fresh start and grow closer to God. Pupils will learn about the <i>Works of Mercy</i>, the ways Christians can help others, and how Lent is a time to live these out by praying, sharing, and caring for people in need.</p> <p>Catholic Social Teaching Focus - Solidarity and Peace</p>	<p>In Spring 1, the children will study <i>Boy Overboard</i> by Morris Gleitzman. They will learn about alphabet poems before writing one of their own. Their fiction focus will be a journey story with a focus on characterisation, the use of pronouns and metaphors. Their non-fiction text will be a newspaper report with a focus on audience, determiners, adverbials and word classes.</p> <p>In Spring 2, the children will study the children's version of <i>Beowulf</i> written by Michael Morpurgo. They will write a list poem with a historical context focus. Their fiction focus will be to write their own Myths and Legends with a focus on action with use of onomatopoeia and metaphors. Their non-fiction writing will be a non-chronological report where they will incorporate adverbials, use of pronouns and determiners.</p>
<p>Science</p> <p>Sound</p> <p>Year 4 will finish their topic on sound reviewing their knowledge on the ear, volume and pitch. They will measure volume in decibels.</p> <p>Changing States:</p> <p>Children will compare materials as solids, liquids, or gases, observe changes in state when heated or cooled, and measure temperatures in degrees Celsius. They will study evaporation and condensation in the water cycle.</p>	<p>Year 4 Spring Term</p> <p>'Journeys & Monsters, Myths and Mysteries'</p> <p>Your Adventure Awaits..!</p>    <p>Jesus Walks on Water</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Roman Mosaics</p> <p>Children will refine their artistic techniques, including drawing and designing using materials like pencils, pastels, tiles and grout. They will record observations in sketchbooks, explore creative ideas and designers. They will create their own Roman mosaic coasters once they have studied different roman mosaic techniques.</p> <p>Anglo Saxon Brooches</p> <p>Year 4 will study different Anglo Saxon brooch designs, their purpose and how they were created using different materials. They will study several metalworking techniques and design their own Anglo Saxon brooch. They will then use clay, tools and tool-techniques such as rolling and carving to create their own brooch. Finally they will paint their brooch!</p>

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P.E	History	Computing
<p><u>Basketball:</u> Children will develop skills in dribbling, passing, shooting, defence, teamwork, and understanding the game.</p> <p><u>Problem Solving</u> This unit focuses on helping children understand what makes an effective team by developing their communication, collaboration and leadership skills. Through a range of group challenges, pupils learn to create tactics together, take on leadership roles and practise the key skills needed to work successfully as part of a team</p> <p><u>Swimming:</u> Children will develop swimming skills and water confidence.</p>	<p><u>The Roman Empire and Britain:</u> Children will explore the Roman Empire's impact on Britain, including its expansion, invasion and conquest. They will examine the Romanisation of Britain looking at creations such as Roman baths and villas. They will learn about Boudicca's rebellion from various perspectives. Investigating Hadrian's Wall, children will study its features and use maps to locate it. They will also explore Roman culture and beliefs.</p> <p><u>Britain's Settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Scots:</u> Children will study the 5th-century invasions of the Scots and Anglo-Saxons, discovering their origins, settlements, and the resulting changes in Britain. They will explore how the Anglo-Saxons influenced the English language and analyse artefacts to learn about life during this era. Through examining village life, occupations and homes, children will gain insights into Anglo-Saxon society. They will explore early Pagan beliefs, their gods and the widespread conversion to Christianity by the 7th century.</p>	<p><u>E-Safety:</u> Children will learn to stay safe online, including on social networks and how to send and receive emails securely.</p> <p><u>Repetition in Shapes</u> Children will explore programming with repetition and loops, using Logo to plan, modify and test commands to create shapes and patterns.</p> <p><u>Repetition in Games</u> This unit teaches learners how to use repetition in Scratch to create and improve animations and games. They explore count-controlled and infinite loops, compare Scratch with Logo, and apply programming design skills to build their own game.</p>
	<p><u>PSHE</u></p> <p><u>Me, My Body, My Health:</u> Children meet AJ, learning to celebrate differences, appreciate their bodies as gifts from God, and care for them.</p> <p><u>Emotional Wellbeing:</u> Children will understand feelings versus actions, learn to manage emotions, and explore ways to maintain emotional health.</p>	

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
