

<p>In the Spring Term, Year 6 will focus on manipulating fractions, decimals and percentages and converting between them. We will then move onto algebra – finding unknowns and solving multistep equations. Finally, we will explore shape and measure, ratio and scale factors and graphs and charts.</p>	<p align="center"><u>Galilee to Jerusalem</u></p> <p>Year 6 will explore how St John presents Jesus as the Messiah through seven signs and 'I am' statements. Each sign reveals a deeper truth about Jesus' divine nature and the number seven signifies completeness in Scripture. They will reflect on Jesus' call to trust in him, connecting these signs to the Church's sacramental life, recognising that the signs show where God's grace becomes visible and active.</p> <p align="center">CST – Solidarity and Peace</p>	<p align="center"><u>Desert to Garden</u></p> <p>Year 6 children will encounter key texts from John's Gospel, including the Last Supper, Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion. They will learn that Jesus showed his love by washing his disciples' feet and by dying on the cross to reconcile the world to God, and that Mary is mother of all Christians. They will explore how Holy Thursday recalls these events, and how the Stations of the Cross invite prayerful reflection on Christ's passion.</p> <p align="center">CST – Communication and Participation</p>	<p>This term the children will study Goodnight Mr Tom by Michelle Magorian. Set at the outbreak of WWII, this book explores the lives of evacuees from London – linking with our history topic. The children will explore a range of text types, including poetry, persuasive letters, newspaper reports, diary entries, narratives and radio announcements. Furthermore, they will focus on proofreading, editing skills and redrafting.</p>
Science	<p align="center">Year 6 Spring Term</p> <p align="center">Theme: The Home Front</p>		Computing
<p>In Science, the children will study the topics 'Evolution and Inheritance' and 'Light'. We will identify inherited characteristics and explore how animals and plants adapt to their environment. They will learn about how light travels and reflects to make colour. Children will use their scientific enquiry skills to investigate through experiments and analysis.</p>			<p>In Computing, the children will look at E-Safety and what acceptable online communication looks like. The children will learn about Web Page creation and create their own web page online. They will also explore spreadsheets and different ways of calculating and presenting data, using formulas.</p>
P.E	Art	History	PSHE
<p>In PE this term, the children will develop a number of attacking and defending skills in netball and hockey. They will also learn about different dance styles and movements and choreograph a routine, combining dance sequences fluently and effectively. Children will also have the opportunity to develop orienteering skills.</p>	<p>In Art, the children will explore drawing and sketching skills, street art, painting and printmaking. They will create WWII inspired sketches and learn about the work of Henry Moore. Inspired by Banksy, they will create mixed media prints D-Day prints. Year 6 will study the work of Andy Warhol and create a Maya themed mixed media artwork using printmaking. The children will learn about Frida Kahlo and create a piece of modern art in her style.</p>	<p>This term in History the children will study 'The Home Front'. They will gain an understanding of the timeline of events during WWII and build a picture of how people's lives changed during that time. The children will visit the Imperial War Museum. The children will also study the Maya Civilisation using primary and secondary sources to understand more about them.</p> <p>As part of the whole school focus, the children will learn about clothing during WWII and during the Maya civilization and make comparisons with how we dress today.</p>	<p>In PSHE, the children will study emotional well-being and lifecycles. They will learn about how their life online impacts their emotional wellbeing and their relationship with God. In life cycles, the children will learn how we are all created from God, in his image. They will learn about relationships, respect and families.</p>
