<p>This term, the children will look at E-Safety: what acceptable online communication looks like and managing Gaming Addiction. In Summer 1, the children will develop their knowledge and understanding of using a digital device to produce 3D models. The second unit, Sensing Movement, brings together all the elements of programming concepts from KS2 and the children will programme Micro:bits to sense movement.</p>	<p align="center"><u>To the Ends of the Earth</u></p> <p>In this branch, pupils explore St John's account of the Resurrection and how it restores humanity's relationship with God. They make links between Genesis and the Resurrection, recognising Jesus as the 'last Adam' who brings new life, and explore key symbols such as the garden, light and darkness, and Mary Magdalene's encounter with Jesus. Pupils deepen their understanding of faith through the gift of the Holy Spirit and the story of Thomas, reflecting on belief, evidence and choice. They also consider how to bear witness to the Resurrection today and learn from the example of ^{St Stephen} CST – Dignity of the Worker</p>	<p align="center"><u>Dialogue and Encounter</u></p> <p>Pupils explore what dialogue looks like in action, considering how people of faith live as good neighbours, work for justice and the common good, and share aspects of their spiritual lives. They reflect on the Christian call to uphold human dignity and serve their communities, and consider how worldviews shape understanding. Pupils also study a Dharmic faith, exploring religious life in contemporary ^{Britain} CST – Human Dignity</p>	<p>In Science, our topic will be Living Things and their Habitats and the children will describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics, based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals. Children will use their scientific enquiry skills to investigate through experiments and analysis.</p>	<p>This term the children will study <i>A Long Walk to Water</i> by Linda Sue Park and <i>The Final Year</i> by Matt Goodfellow. <i>A Long Walk to Water</i> begins as two stories, told in alternating sections, about two eleven-year-olds in Sudan, a girl in 2008 and a boy in 1985. The <i>Final Year</i> is an extraordinary verse novel about the final year of Primary School and preparing for the transition to Secondary School. The children will explore a range of text types and focus on proofreading, editing skills and redrafting.</p>
PSHE		Year 6 Summer Term		Geography
<p>In PSHE, children will explore how their religious understanding deepens their understanding and appreciation of the three-part community of love. Children will learn that the Trinity demonstrates the perfect loving community, and we are called to emulate this self-giving and self-sacrificing love in our communities. Through examples of God's love in action throughout Scripture, children will learn how God wants us to live in society with one another.</p>		  	<p>This term in Geography, the children will learn about the human and physical characteristics and key topographical features of the UK. They will use a compass to complete fieldwork to observe, measure, record and present the human and physical features in the local area. Furthermore, they will identify the position and significance of latitude, longitude, Equator, Northern Hemisphere, Southern Hemisphere, the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn, Arctic and Antarctic Circle, the Prime/Greenwich Meridian and time zones</p>

<p>In PE this term, the children will use running, jumping, throwing, catching and hitting in isolation and in combination. They will play competitive sports: tennis, rounders, cricket, practicing hitting and throwing techniques. Through athletics, the children will develop flexibility, strength, technique, control</p>	<p>In the Summer Term, Year 6 will focus on problem solving and applying it to real world situations such as cooking, recipes, profit and loss, climate and sustainability. In addition, the children will consolidate their knowledge on some of the topics covered this year to prepare them for Secondary School</p>	<p>In D&T the children will explore seasonal foods around the world and eating sustainably. They will discuss nutrients, healthy eating and then practise peeling, chopping, slicing, and grating skills. Finally, they will draw on all this knowledge to prepare and cook Transylvanian Goulash.</p>		<p>In Art, the children will learn about Black British Artist, Eugene Palmer, and create a piece of artwork in his style: looking at repetition, colour and painting techniques.</p>
