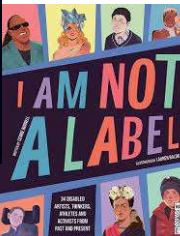
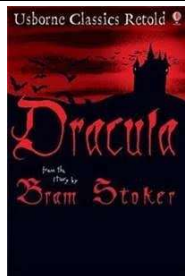

In the Autumn Term, Year 6 will focus on Number and Place value and strengthen our understanding of the four operations. We will then move on to working with fractions in a range of ways including: adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing, finding equivalence and comparing. Children will also look at geometry and position and direction.	<u>Creation and Covenant</u> Year 6 will explore the second Creation account in Genesis and the Prologue of St John’s Gospel to understand human nature and God’s generosity. They’ll reflect on themes like free will, companionship, responsibility, and original sin. These ideas will be linked to Church teachings, including the Nicene Creed and Pope Francis’ <i>Laudato Si’</i>, showing how faith and science together deepen our understanding of Creation. CST – Care for Creation	<u>Prophecy and Promise</u> Year 6 children will explore the stories of prominent women in the Old Testament, recognising the historical and cultural context of a patriarchal society. They will learn how women such as Miriam, Ruth, Judith, Esther, Sarah and Hannah subverted expectations of their time, showing courage, faith and hope, making links between these women and Mary. They will reflect on the titles given to Mary and consider the mystery of the Incarnation. CST – Preferential Option for the Poor	This Term the children will study two core texts: ‘Dracula’ by Bram Stoker, retold by Mike Stocks and in the second half term, ‘I Am Not A Label’ Cerrie Burnell. They will also explore a range of non-fiction texts about inspiring people such as ‘Fantastic Female Explorers, and ‘Hidden Figures’. The children will explore a range of text types, including narrative, diary entries, formal and informal letters, persuasive arguments and poetry. Furthermore, they will focus on proofreading, editing skills and redrafting.

In Science, the children will study the topics ‘Animals, including Humans’ and ‘Electricity’. The children will investigate the components of a heart and how to keep your heart healthy, including a real-life dissection experience. They will create parallel and series circuits and explore how electricity works. Children will use their scientific enquiry skills to investigate through experiments and analysis.			In Computing, the children will look at E- Safety and what Fake News is and how to spot it. They will learn about Communication and collaboration, exploring how data is transferred by working collaboratively online. They will also learn about Variables in games in their coding unit, exploring variables when designing and coding a game.

In PE this term, the children will develop their flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance in the unit ‘Health Related Exercise’. They will also complete the ‘Tag Rugby’ unit where they will build their skills in defending and attacking as well as learning a number of different passing styles.	This term Year 6 will design and build a Dracula themed ‘puppet show’. They will study current market examples, research their target market, explore different gears and pulleys, design their own cams, practise their cutting skills, and finally evaluate the final product.	This term in History Year 6 will learn about Black British History from WWI through WWII. The children will reflect on the treatment of Black British soldiers and civilians during WWI and through to WWII and compare this to today.	This term in Geography, the children will study the continent of Australia. They will begin by exploring the physical features, regions and climates of Australia. They will then look at the population and social diversity and the flora & fauna, Finally, they will discover famous landmarks and tourism.	PSHE is the subject in focus and the children will study two modules: ‘Created and Loved by God’. Children will explore the ‘individual’ and develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships.
